All 82 regular season games, the entire preseason and the Pelicans' playoff contests will be heard on the team's flagship station WRNO, 99.5 FM, as the Pelicans enter their first of a multi-season agreement with iHeartMedia, Inc. **Todd Graffagnini** is in his fifth season as the radio voice of the Pelicans, **John DeShazier** is in his 12th season as color analyst and **Erin Summers** enters her third season as the sideline reporter for the Pelicans Radio team. Graffagnini and DeShazier will also host a weekly insider show featuring interviews with Pelicans players, coaches, front office executives and other guests.

- The Thunder outshot the Pelicans, converting 37-of-85 (.435) from the floor, 10-of-32 (.312) from three-point range and 10-of-13 (.769) from the free throw line, while New Orleans shot 37-of-96 (.385) from the floor, 11-of-39 (.282) from behind the arc and 7-of-9 (.778) from the charity stripe.
- The Pelicans outrebounded the Thunder 52-44, including 18-8 on the offensive glass, which led to the Pelicans outscoring the Thunder 24-11 in second chance points.
- The Thunder outscored the Pelicans 20-7 in fast break points.
- The Pelicans turned the ball over 14 times leading to 14 points for the Thunder, while Oklahoma City committed 13 miscues leading to 11 points for New Orleans.
- In Game 1 there were 20 lead changes and 13 times where the game was tied. The Pelicans led by as many as seven points, while the Thunder led by as many as 10 points.
- Trey Murphy III led the way for the Pelicans, posting 21 points, four rebounds, two assists, a steal and three blocks, while shooting 5-of-12 (.416) from three-point range.

- Despite being outscored 12-6 in points in the paint in the first quarter, the Thunder outscored the Pelicans 48-46 in points in the paint for the entire game.
- The Pelicans turned the ball over 18 times leading to 22 points for the Thunder, while Oklahoma City only had nine miscues leading to six points for New Orleans.
- The Thunder led by as many as 34, while the Pelicans only led by five points.
- The Thunder outscored the Pelicans 14-6 in fast break points.
- Jonas Valančiūnas led the way for the Pelicans, posting a team-high 19 points and hauled in a team-high seven boards.
- Off the bench, Naji Marshall posted 10 points, two boards and a steal in 25 minutes of play.
- Shai Gilgeous-Alexander notched a game-high 33 points, shooting 13-of-19 (.684) from the field, 3-of-5 (.600) from three-point range and a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line.

- The Thunder outshot the Pelicans, converting 40-of-83 (.482) from the floor and 17-of-36 (.472) from behind the arc, while New Orleans only shot 32-of-84 (.381) from the field and 9-of-32 (.281) from three-point range.
- New Orleans turned the ball over 21 times leading to 23 points for the Thunder, while Oklahoma City had 16 miscues leading to 12 points for the Pelicans.
- The Thunder outscored the Pelicans 21-16 in fast break points, while New Orleans outscored Oklahoma City 15-7 in second chance points.
- The Pelicans were held to 19 points in the first frame, shooting 8-of-22 (.364) from the floor, 2-of-8 (.250) from three-point range and a perfect 1-of-1 from the free throw stripe.
- Brandon Ingram posted 19 points, four rebounds and one assist, while shooting 7-of-14 (.500) from the floor, including 2-of-3 (.667) from three-point range.
- Off the bench, Larry Nance Jr. notched nine points and a game-high 13 rebounds, while converting 3-of-6 (.500) from the floor, 1-of-2 (.500) from dep and 2-of-3 (.667) from the foul line.

- Lakers outshot the Pelicans from behind the arc, shooting 14-of-35 (.400), while New Orleans only shot 9-of-30 (.300) from threepoint range.
- The Lakers shot 26-of-29 (.897) from the free throw line, while the Pelicans only shot 11-of-15 (.733) from the charity stripe.
- The Pelicans turned the ball over 13 times leading to 12 points for the Lakers, while Los Angeles only had eight miscues leading to five points for New Orleans.
- New Orleans outscored the Lakers 62-36 in points in the paint.
- Zion Williamson notched a game-high 40 points, shooting 17-of-27 (.630) from the floor and 6-of-9 (.667) from the free throw line.
- Off the bench, Trey Murphy III scored 12 points, shooting 5-of-10 (.500) from the field and 2-of-6 (.333) from three-point range. Murphy added four rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 31 minutes of play.
- Herb Jones shot 4-of-7 (.571) from the field including 2-of-4 (.500) from deep. Jones finished the game with ten points and two steals.
- Off the bench, Jose Alvarado dished out a team-high seven assists to go along with ten points and two boards.
- With the win, the Lakers are the seventh seed in the Western Conference and will face off against the Denver Nuggets in the first round of the NBA Playoffs.
- LeBron James led the way for the Lakers, posting a team-high 23 points, shooting 6-of-20 (.300) from the field and a perfect 10-of-10 from the free throw line.
- Anthony Davis posted 20 points, 15 rebounds, one steal and three blocks, while converting 6-of-16 (.375) from the floor and 8-of-10 (.800) from the free throw stripe.
- D'Angelo Russell notched 21 points, shooting 7-of-14 (.500) from the floor, 5-of-11 (.455) from three-point range and a perfect 2-of-2 from the free throw line. Russell added six dimes, one steal and one block. In the first quarter, Russell notched 13 points, on 4-of-7 (.571) from the floor, including 3-of-5 (.600) from three-point distance.

Road Dogs: Over the course of the season, New Orleans stacked wins while facing opponents on the road.

- During the 23-24 NBA season, the New Orleans Pelicans **won the most road games** in the NBA (28 road victories). Additionally, New Orleans' 28 road wins is the **most road victories in franchise history**.
- On the road, the Pelicans are **ranked 2nd** in three-point percentage (39.7%), **ranked 2nd** in plus/minus (plus-5.3), **ranked 3rd** in field goal percentage (49.2%), **ranked 6th** in rebounds (44.4) and **ranked 6th** in steals (7.9).
- On the road, New Orleans is **ranked 2nd** in net rating (5.4), **ranked 4th** in defensive rating (111.8) and is **ranked 7th** in offensive rating (117.2).

Road Warriors: On January 31, 2024, the Pelicans defeated the Houston Rockets 110-99.

- With the win, New Orleans has won a road game at each of the other four Southwest division's place this season. This is the first time in franchise history that New Orleans has defeated each of the other four Southwest divisional opponents on the road in the same season.

Double-Digit Wins: New Orleans finished the 2023-24 regular season posting numerous double-digit wins this season.

- The Pelicans finished the regular season **tied for 2nd in the NBA** for the most double-digit wins, posting 32 games where the Pelicans won by at least 10-points.
- Additionally, New Orleans **ranked 3rd in the NBA** in games won by 20-plus points, posting 16 games on the season.

Reserves: Over the course of the season, the Pelicans' bench dominated their opponents.

- New Orleans' bench finished the regular season **ranked 1st** in steals per game (3.6), **tied for 2nd** in plus/minus (plus-2.2), **ranked 3rd** in net rating (2.9) and **ranked 6th** in three-point percentage (37.1%).

Pesky Pels: The Pelicans caused havoc on the defensive end of the ball this season. Below is a look at where New Orleans ranked amongst NBA teams in defensive categories.

- New Orleans finished the season **ranked 3rd** in steals per game (8.3) **and tied for 5th in the NBA** in deflections per game (15.4), which led the Pelicans to finish **ranked 5th in the NBA** in points off of turnovers, averaging 17.6 per game.

- On December 17, 2023, the Pelicans defeated the San Antonio Spurs 146-110. The Pelicans 36-point differential is tied for the **fifth-largest** in franchise history.

First Quarter Fire: On 3/1 vs. IND, the Pelicans started off hot, scoring 48 points on 20-of-22 (.909) from the floor in the first quarter.

- The Pelicans' 48 first quarter points, ties a franchise record for points scored in any quarter.
- Additionally, the Pelicans' 20 made field goals, marks as franchise-high for most field goals in any quarter.
- In the play-by-play era (since the 1997-98 season), 20-for-22 shooting from the floor is tied for the second-highest field goal percentage by a team in a quarter with a minimum of 20 field goals attempted.
- In the first quarter, Brandon Ingram led the way for the Pelicans, scoring 19 points, shooting 9-of-11 (.818) from the floor, including a perfect 1-of-1 from three-point range. His 19 points scored in the quarter marks his **third-highest point total for any quarter in his career**.

2nd Quarter Eruption: On 12/13 at WAS, the Pelicans scored 47 second quarter points which marks the team's **highest-scoring second frame in franchise history**. Additionally, this marks the **second-highest scoring quarter in franchise history**. New Orleans outshot Washington during the quarter, converting 17-of-24 (.708) from the field, including 9-of-11 (.818) from behind the arc. The Pelicans also sunk a perfect 4-of-4 from the charity stripe. They held the Wizards to 11-of-21 (.524) from the field and 5-of-10 (.500) from deep. New Orleans notched four fast break points and 10 points off Washington turnovers. The Pelicans also out-rebounded the Wizards 10-3. Starters CJ McCollum and Brandon Ingram both put up 13 points in the quarter.

Happy New Year: On January 2, 2024, the Pelicans started the new year off on the right foot. The Pelicans beat the Brooklyn Nets 112-85 in regulation.

- Through the first three quarters of action, New Orleans held Brooklyn to just 58 points, which marks a **low in the NBA for a team through three quarters this season**. The last team to score 58 or fewer points through the first three quarters in a regular season game was Portland (58) on March 27, 2023 vs. New Orleans.
- Additionally, the Pelicans finished the game with McCollum leading the way with 16 points.
 - The Last time in New Orleans franchise history to win a game by 25 or more points with no player scoring 20-plus points was 1/27/2012, when New Orleans beat the Orlando Magic 93-67. The leading scorer for the Pelicans in that game was Carl Landry with 17 points off the bench.

Inaugural In-Season Tournament: On 12/4, the Pelicans faced the Kings for the third time this season in an In-Season Tournament quarter-final. Brandon Ingram led the team with 30 points, eight boards, six assists and one steal. After falling behind early in the first quarter, New Orleans outshot Sacramento in the second frame, shooting 12-of-21 (.571) from the field, 6-of-10 (.600) from three, and 4-of-5 (.800) from the charity stripe. Leading 69-61 at the half, New Orleans maintained their lead over Sacramento for the remainder of the game. The Pelicans outscored the Kings 52-38 in the paint, and 17-13 in second chance points. The Pelicans bench proved integral in the win, totaling 29 points, three blocks, five steals and ten boards. The win marked the Pelicans' third against the Kings this season, and secured New Orleans' spot in the first-ever In-Season Tournament semifinals. The team travelled to Las Vegas, where they faced the Lakers on 12/7. The Pelicans fell 133-89 to Los Angeles, who went on to win the NBA Cup. The Pelicans return to their regularly scheduled season with a home game vs. Minnesota on Monday, 12/11.

Won't Bow Down: On November 1, 2023, the New Orleans Pelicans overcame a **22-point deficit**, which is **tied for the third-largest comeback** in franchise history. Additionally, the Pelicans 22-point comeback in Oklahoma City, marks the **largest road comeback in franchise history**.

Mr. Mid-Range: Brandon Ingram was dependable from the mid-range during the 2023-24 regular season.

- Ingram has connected on **168-of-346 (.480)** from the mid-range, **which ranks 4th in the NBA** in total field goals made from the 'mid-range' zone.
- Additionally, Ingram sunk 2.6 field goals per game, which is **ranked 5th in the NBA** from the mid-range.
- Lastly, Ingram shot 48.3% from the 'mid-range' zone during the 2023-24 season.

- During the season, McCollum shot 208-of-489 (.425) on above the break three-pointers, which is **ranked 1st in the NBA** (min. 7 3PA per game).
- Additionally, McCollum shot 42.9% from three-point range, which **ranked 1st in the NBA** for any player attempting eight or more threes a game.

All 82: Pelicans center Jonas Valančiūnas became the 11th player in franchise history to play all 82 games in a season.

- The last players to accomplish this feat in New Orleans were E'Twaun Moore and Darius Miller during the 2017-18 season.
- Additionally, Valančiūnas will become the **4th player in franchise history** to start all 82 games in a season, alongside Robin Lopez (2012-13), Jamaal Magloire (2002-03 & 2003-04) and Emeka Okafor (2009-10).
- Lastly, Valančiūnas is **1-of-6 players in the NBA** to start all 82 games during the 2023-24 regular season.

1-of-1: On 2/5 vs. TOR, Brandon Ingram posted a **season-high** 41 points, nine assists, six rebounds and a block while committing zero turnovers in under 30 minutes of play.

- This performance marks the **first time in NBA history** that a player has posted 40-plus points, nine-plus assists, zero turnovers in 30 minutes or less.
- Ingram finished the first half with 21 points, five rebounds and four assists, while shooting 9-of-11 (.818) from the floor, including 2-of-3 (.667) from three-point range. Ingram's 81.8% field goal percentage is the **highest field goal percentage in any half of Ingram's career** (min. 10 field goal attempts).
- In the third quarter, Ingram scored 20 points, which is the **second-most points he's scored in any quarter in his career**.
- Additionally, Ingram converted 6-of-8 (.750) from three-point range in the third frame. Ingram's six made three-pointers in the third quarter marks the **most threes by any Pelicans player in franchise history in a single quarter**.
- Ingram's 20 points and five assists in the third quarter, marks the first time in franchise history a player has posted 18-plus points and five-plus assists in a single quarter.
- Lastly, Ingram became the **fourth player in New Orleans franchise history** to shoot 75% or better on 20-plus field goal attempts.

STAT LINE: On December 26, 2023, Pelicans forward Brandon Ingram posted 24 points, seven assists, six rebounds, three steals and **tied a career-high** with four blocks. This is the **third time in franchise history** that a player has posted 20-plus points, five-plus assists, five-plus rebounds, three-plus steals and four-plus blocks in a single game. The other two players to accomplish this feat were Anthony Davis (10/26/2016) and DeMarcus Cousins (2/23/2017). Additionally, this is only the 14th time in the last five years that a player has posted these numbers in a game.

Consecutive 3's: Pelicans rookie Jordan Hawkins made at least one three-pointer in 21 consecutive games to start his NBA career. This is the **most consecutive games sinking a three-pointer to start a player's career in NBA history**. Below is a look at who Hawkins surpassed:

 - In 2021-22, the Pelicans earned their first playoff berth of Griffin's tenure. The ninth-seed in the Western Conference, New Orleans won both Play-In Tournament games to clinch a First Round matchup against the Phoenix Suns, in which they pushed the one-seed to six games.
- On April 17, 2019, David Griffin was named the Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations, becoming the eighth individual in franchise history to lead the organization's player and personnel decisions.
- Griffin was named the Vice President of Basketball Operations for the Cleveland Cavaliers in September 2010 and was elevated to General Manager on February 6, 2014.
 - During Griffin's tenure in Cleveland, the Cavaliers reached the NBA Finals for three consecutive seasons from 2015-17, winning the NBA Championship in 2016, becoming the first team in NBA Finals history to overcome a 3-1 deficit.
 - Prior to joining Cleveland, Griffin spent 17 seasons with the Phoenix Suns, moving to the basketball operations department in 1997 after beginning in media

relations. Along the way, Griffin held titles of senior vice president of basketball operations, assistant general manager, director of player personnel, assistant director of player personnel and basketball operations assistant.

COACH'S BIO:**WILLIE GREEN – DETROIT MERCY****Coaching Notes**

- Appointed head coach on July 22, 2021, his first head coaching position in the NBA. Green enters his third season with New Orleans.
- On 1/7/24 at SAC, notched his 100th career win in the NBA.
- In his second season as the Pelicans Head Coach, Green led the team to a 42-40 overall record, the team's best record since 2017-18. The Pelicans finished the regular season ranked sixth in defensive rating (112.0) and ranked 10th in net rating (1.9). Green led the Pelicans to a ninth-place finish in the Western Conference, where New Orleans fell to Oklahoma City in the Play-In Tournament.

• In his first season with the Pelicans, Green led the team to its first playoff appearance since 2018. Praised around the league for his steady and calm demeanor, Green helped the Pelicans overcome a 1-12 start to the season to earn the ninth seed and reach the postseason Play-In Tournament. The Pelicans defeated San Antonio and the LA Clippers to clinch a First Round matchup against the Phoenix Suns, in which they pushed the one-seed to six games.

• Spent the previous two seasons (2019-21) as an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns. Helped guide the 2021 Western Conference Champions to their first NBA Finals appearance since 1993. As the Suns' defensive coordinator, Phoenix finished the regular season with the NBA's sixth-best defensive rating. He also served as the Phoenix's head coach for NBA Summer League in 2019, leading the Suns to a 3-1 record in Las Vegas.

• Helped the Warriors win back-to-back NBA Championships in 2017 and 2018 before returning to the NBA Finals in 2019. He also served as the Warriors' head coach for NBA Summer League in 2018, leading Golden State to the California Classic's only 3-0 record.

• A 12-year NBA veteran as a player, Green averaged 8.3 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 731 regular season games (297 starts) with Philadelphia, New Orleans, Atlanta, the LA Clippers and Orlando from 2003-2015.

• Was selected 41st overall by Seattle in the 2003 NBA Draft.

• Was a four-year standout at the University of Detroit Mercy. A native of Detroit, he won Horizon League Player of the Year as a senior in 2003 and helped the Titans to two NIT appearances in 2001 and 2002, including a trip to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden in 2001. Green remains fourth in program history in career points scored.

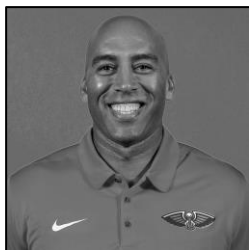

Ingram finished the first half with 21 points, five rebounds and four assists, while shooting 9-of-11 (.818) from the floor, including 2-of-3 (.667) from three-point range. Ingram's 81.8% field goal percentage is the **highest field goal percentage in any half of Ingram's career** (min. 10 field goal attempts). In the third quarter, Ingram scored 20 points, which is the **second-most points he's scored in any quarter in his career**. Additionally, Ingram converted 6-of-8 (.750) from three-point range in the third frame. Ingram's six made three-pointers in the third quarter marks the most threes by any **Pelicans player in franchise history in a single quarter**. Lastly, Ingram's 20 points and five assists in the third quarter, marks the first time in franchise history a player has posted 18-plus points and five-plus assists in a single quarter.
- On 3/1 vs. IND, finished the game with 34 points on 13-of-21 (.619) shooting, including 1-of-2 (.500) from deep. Ingram added eight rebounds and seven assists in 30 minutes played. In the first quarter, Ingram scored 19 points, shooting 9-of-11 (.818) from the floor, including a perfect 1-of-1 from three-point range. His 19 points scored in the quarter marks his third-highest point total for any quarter in his career.
- On 3/16 vs. POR, finished the game with 22 points, shooting 10-of-21 (.476) from the floor. Ingram tied a **career-high** with four blocks to go along with seven rebounds, two assists and a steal. In the first half, Ingram swatted three shots, which is tied for the most blocks in any half of his career.
